

Use this list as a guide – bring clothes that you are most comfortable wearing.

Remember: We do laundry once a week

ADDITIONAL ITEMS (Check out the enclosed "Gear-to-Go" flyer)

- Sleeping Bag in a "stuff sack". We recommend a sleeping bag that is rated at approximately 30 degrees. (Don't worry – it will never be that cold while we are camping this summer!)
Please DO NOT purchase a stuff sack exceeding 11" x 21".
We strongly recommend the Compression Stuff Sack, easily ordered from our "Gear-to-Go" flyer.
- Camping Pillow (see "Gear-to-Go" flyer)
- Toiletries (soap, toothpaste, shampoo, etc.)
- Camera
- Flashlight
- Water bottle
- Sunglasses
- Stationery and Stamps
- Notebook to keep a journal of your trip

We STRONGLY DISCOURAGE bringing valuable items on tour (expensive jewelry, hand-bags, etc.) Tour members do not need to be burdened with the responsibility of caring for these items while on tour.

LUGGAGE (Refer to the enclosed "Gear-to-Go" flyer for size appropriate choices.)

We can not accommodate luggage that is larger than the following specifications:

- Duffel bag, not exceeding 30"L x 15"D x 14"H. A rolling duffel with handle and wheels is recommended.
- 1 "Carry-on" bag, no larger than 21" x 10" x 12." This bag will be carried on to the airplane, and will also ride with you in the bus. Please note that this is a small bag, conveniently used for items that will not fit in your duffel, and that you may want to access during the day when traveling. This is NOT a second duffel or suitcase. Carry-on bags larger than the specified dimensions will be sent home.
- 1 small back pack (optional). A back pack can be handy when touring and hiking. If you choose to bring a back pack, it must be empty, and packed inside your duffel bag on the first day of your tour. If you will be using your back pack as your "carry-on" bag, you may carry it on the first day of tour. Only one carry-on item will be permitted when checking in for your tour.

PACKING INSTRUCTIONS

There is a proper storage place for each item on the bus. However, space is limited, so we must ask for your cooperation:

- **THE MAXIMUM PACKED WEIGHT OF YOUR SUITCASE OR DUFFEL IS 50 POUNDS! This limit is imposed by the airlines, and a fee will be charged by the airlines each time we fly for luggage exceeding 50 pounds.**
- Your sleeping bag is carried separately, and does not go inside your suitcase. It must fit into the stuff sack, as it will be stored in the overhead compartments of the bus when we are traveling. The sleeping bag may not be put in a laundry bag or duffel bag.
- Your carry-on bag must be small enough to fit under your bus seat. **Please keep in mind Airport Security Regulations when packing your carry-on bag.**
